

Curvy furniture is a major anticipated trend of 2020, as it's stylish, practical and easy to navigate around.


Curved furniture encourages conversation among family and friends.

Macramé, wicker, rattan are rough textures that work well. Rope, natural agate and burled wood are other textures to consider.










On-going trends

Utilizing coffee table vs. ottoman




Slipcover upholstered furniture is back.
